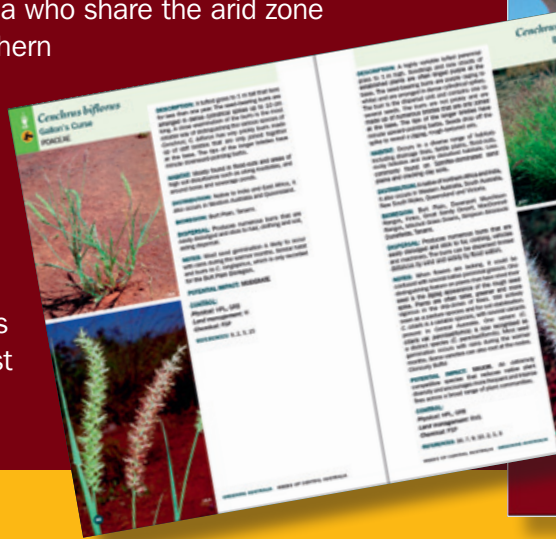

Greening Australia

HABITS

- 1 Tree: a woody single stemmed plant greater than 2 m tall
- 2 Tall Shrub: a woody multi-stemmed plant less than 6 m tall
- 4 Shrub: a woody multi-stemmed plant less than 2 m tall
- 12 Groundcover: a non-woody plant usually less than 5 cm tall
- 3 Vine: a plant with a weak stem that derives support from climbing or creeping
- 14 Grass: a non-woody plant with narrow strap like leaves, generally growing in tussocks

USES

- attracts birds to your garden
- provides shade
- useful for planting in courtyards or small gardens
- screening plant
- suited to rocky areas
- barrier plant with prickles
- will grow under shade
- grows well in clay soils
- salt tolerant
