Greening Australia and our community partners have a vision of creating a landscape scale Biolink within the Peel Harvey Catchment that connects the Darling Scarp to the shores of the Peel Estuary.

With thanks to support from Alcoa of Australia, we are committed to supporting local farmers and land owners to build resilient communities in a changing environment.

The Biolink will create connectivity within a fragmented landscape that incorporates conservation and productivity values and includes a number of actions to maintain and improve the broader ecosystem across this landscape.

Funding has kindly been provided by Alcoa of Australia to allow us to develop suitable project sites for landowners within the Peel Harvey Catchment that align with the following project themes:

- Revegetation using local native species on non-productive land use zones;
- Buffering of remnant vegetation and conservation of ecologically sensitive areas;
- Biodiversity and habitat restoration to enhance connectivity;
- Assist landowners with Natural Resource Management and Landcare objectives.

This funding will support project sites with costs associated with:

- Site selection, planning and preparation;
- Revegetation using best practice direct seeding technologies and/or native seedling plantings;
- Ongoing Landcare consultation, support and advice;
- Continued monitoring and evaluation.

Greening Australia's Peel team is looking forward to working with catchment groups and individuals in the Peel region and would like to hear from you about how we can work together to improve our landscape.


