Direct seeding has been used in many locations around Australia to provide a range of benefits for conservation and production.

It is a quick, cost effective and reliable method of rehabilitation that mimics natural regeneration to create resilient and diverse plantings.

Direct seeding can be customised for a range of sites and circumstances, and can also be combined with other methods of rehabilitation to achieve the best outcomes.

There are two main methods of revegetation - tubestock planting and direct seeding.

Direct seeding involves sowing seed directly into the ground rather than transplanting already established seedlings. This can be done by hand or with a machine, similar to sowing a crop.
