

Direct seeding

The machine direct seeding method is quick, cost effective and low risk.

Direct seeding can cost as little as 10% of the cost of planting tubestock, and can be done much more quickly with minimal labour and site preparation costs.

Because it is quick and cheap, it is appropriate for large areas that would be too expensive to plant with tubestock.

The low cost of direct seeding also makes it very low risk – if the seeding is unsuccessful, for example because of poor climatic conditions, it can easily be redone.
