

Direct seeding

Direct Seeding is a very reliable method of revegetation.

A survey of landholders in the ACT region found that 70% of respondents rated direct seeding as a successful technique with only 7% experiencing complete failure (Wilson 1998).

The most important determinant of direct seeding success is weed control, to reduce competition for water and nutrients.

Correct site preparation, species selection and timing, and protection from herbivores will help to ensure success.
