Did you know?

Guildford soils are described as alluvial (*pronounced al-oo-vee-al*) soils. Alluvial soils are those that have been washed down off the Darling Scarp and transported (carried) on to the Swan Coastal Plain by rivers or creeks. These soils are usually made up of both sand and clay particles, making them very different from the soils closer to the ocean. The soils near the ocean are mostly made up of sand.
