



Did you know?

Did you know that the Quindalup dunes are the youngest dunes on the Swan Coastal Plain and began to be formed around 7,000 (seven thousand) years ago?

Human activity has changed many of the dunes considerably, causing the natural vegetation to disappear and along with it many of the native animals that once lived there. Housing development, roads, schools and shopping centres have all been built on these dunes, reducing the amount of natural vegetation left to look at and observe. There are places along the coast where you can still see the types of vegetation found on these dune systems, for example at Woodman Point, parts of the Trigg Bushland and Swanbourne near the Cottesloe Golf Course.
